It also helps children like 12 year old Liam* from the remote community of Mareeba in Queensland's Far North who dreams of playing for Australia. Liam is inspired to go to school every day so he can join in the JMF sessions during and after school.

Along with skills training, Liam learns mindfulness and emotional self-regulation. At the after school sessions, Liam loves playing football with his friends as well as the hot, nutritious, home-cooked meal served at the end of the session. He is working hard to hopefully secure a JMF Scholarship to study in Sydney that would put him on a pathway to a brighter future.
